S4M-07361 Neil Findlay: Contemptible Campaign Should be Dropped Now—That the Parliament condemns in the strongest possible terms what it considers to be the contemptible campaign launched by the UK Government that includes the message, “In the UK illegally? Go home or face arrest”; believes that this message resembles the racist language prevalent among many far right groups; considers that this campaign has seen the Conservative-led coalition, even by what it considers its own dismal standards, stoop to a new low; asks that this campaign is dropped as a matter of urgency and to ensure that no more public money is wasted on what it believes are such offensive materials, and asks the UK Government to retreat from such discourse and instead act

responsibly by encouraging good cross-community relations rather than indulge in campaigns that it believes can only foster negativity and suspicion between different ethnic groups across the UK.
