The Queen's Speech

The Queen's Speech sets out the UK Government's legislative programme for the next year. This year's Queen's speech included:

Immigration Bill (UK-wide)

Intended to make it easier to deport people who do not have the right to stay in the UK, and prevent immigrants from accessing services to which they are not entitled. Businesses that use illegal labour will face increased fines, and private landlords will be required to check the immigration status of their tenants. The right of appeal against immigration decisions will be restricted, and immigration officers will be given more powers. Foreign nationals who commit serious crimes will be deported except in extraordinary circumstances, and the law will be changed so this principle is reflected in the courts.

Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Bill (mostly England and Wales)

Intended to tackle anti-social behaviour, forced marriage, dangerous dogs and illegal firearms.

Pensions Bill (England, Scotland, and Wales) To introduce a single-tier state-pension system.

Other Westminster The Queen's Speech (continued)

Care Bill (England)

Intended to introduce a cap on the cost of social care, and give carers the legal right to support from their local council.

Offender Rehabilitation Bill (England and Wales)

Intended to introduce a 12 month supervision period for offenders who serve custodial sentences of less than a year.

National Insurance Contributions Bill (UK-wide)

Intended to reduce the cost to small businesses of employing people.

Defence Reform Bill (UK-wide)

Intended to increase the size of the reserve forces to play a greater role in the country's defence.

High Speed Rail (Preparation) Bill (England, Scotland, and Wales)

Intended to authorise the government to spend the money necessary to build the new rail link between London, Birmingham, Manchester and Leeds.

High Speed Two Hybrid Bill (England, Scotland, and Wales)

Intended to give the government the legal power to compulsorily buy the land needed to construct the proposed high speed rail line.

Intellectual Property Bill (UK-wide)

Intended to simplify patent and design protection laws.

Local Audit and Accountability Bill (England and Wales)

Intended to replace Audit Commission with a new local audit framework.

Water Bill (mostly England and Wales, but some provisions will extend to Scotland) Intended to increase competition, and make it easier for new companies to enter the water market.

Mesothelioma Bill (UK-wide)

Intended to help people who suffer from Mesothelioma as a result of exposure to asbestos.

Northern Ireland Bill (Although specific to N Ireland, applies UK-wide)

Intended to introduce technical changes to the way the politics and institutions in Northern Ireland operate.

Gambling (licensing and advertising) Bill (UK-wide)

Not directly mentioned in the speech, but appears in briefing notes as an "other measure". Intended to require overseas gambling operators based overseas to hold a licence from the UK Gambling Commission.

European Union Approvals Bill (UK-wide)

Not directly mentioned in the speech, but appears in briefing notes as an "other measure". Intended to allow the UK to take part in EU measures against counterfeiting the Euro.

Draft Consumer Rights Bill (UK-wide)

Intended to update consumer-protection laws to cover digital purchases such as downloaded music and e-books.

Draft Wales Bill (Although specific to N Ireland, applies UK-wide)

Intended to allow Welsh Assembly candidates to stand on both a regional list and in a constituency, but they would not longer be able to be an MP at the same time.

Other Westminster The Queen's Speech (continued)

Draft Deregulation Bill (England and Wales; some sections also Scotland and N Ireland)

Intended to reduce the amount of regulation for businesses, individuals and public bodies.

Energy Bill (carried over from previous session) (UK-wide) Intended to reform the energy industry.
