Westminster Parliamentary Questions

Doctors: Foreign Workers

Shabana Mahmood: To ask the Secretary of State for Health what assessment he has made on the effect of Tier 2 visa changes on doctors undertaking specialty training. [70485]

Reply from Simon Burns: The Department has worked closely with the Home Office to mitigate the effects of changes to Tier 2 on speciality doctors and other health care professionals.

Currently, students completing the foundation programme switch to Tier 1 Post-Study work to undertake the required speciality training. Following the closure of this category in April 2012, students will be able to switch to Tier 2 and will not be subject to the Resident Labour Market Test.

Shabana Mahmood: To ask the Secretary of State for Health what factors he took into account in respect of workforce planning in the NHS in determining his proposed changes to immigration rules. [70484]

Reply from Simon Burns: The Home Office is the lead Government Department on immigration and any changes to the immigration rules are ultimately made by the Secretary of State for the Home Department, my right hon. Friend the Member for Maidenhead (Mrs May).

The Home Office reviewed Tier 1, 2 and the student route (Tier 4) of the Points Based System. The Department worked closely with the Home Office to mitigate the effects of the proposals on health care professionals.

To improve the effectiveness of workforce planning the Department of Health has developed a Centre for Workforce Intelligence. They will provide a single, authoritative and expert resource on workforce development planning for all parts of the national health service and social care system.

Human Trafficking

Peter Bone: What recent discussions [The Minister for Sport and the Olympics] has had with the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the Government's policy on human trafficking in respect of major sporting events. [70600]

Reply from the Minister for Sport and the Olympics (Hugh Robertson): Regular Olympic briefings take place between my right hon. Friend the Secretary of State, me, Home Office Ministers and the Olympic intelligence centre to discuss threats to the games, including human trafficking. Although there is currently no evidence of an increase in human trafficking linked to the games, the Government are aware of the threat, which is real, and will remain vigilant.

Peter Bone: ... The danger of modern-day slavery at the Olympics is great. I appreciate that the Government have recognised that in their new strategy on human trafficking, which talks about the intelligence leading up to the games, but can he tell us a little more about how that works?

Reply from Hugh Robertson: ... We have a bespoke Olympics intelligence centre, which looks specifically at intelligence leads surrounding information of all sorts feeding into the Olympics. As my hon. Friend correctly says, there is evidence that hosting world-class sports competitions can, in certain circumstances, lead to an increase in human trafficking. As yet there is no hard evidence that that is happening, but the threat remains and we will remain vigilant.

Tessa Jowell: ... The Minister will have seen the March 2010 report published by London Councils which examined the potential impact of the games on trafficking. I know that he shares my long-standing concern that the games should be safe for women and that London should be a no-go area for evil exploitation by traffickers. The London Councils report suggested that there was a particular risk that the number of Roma people trafficked for begging would increase. Have there been discussions with the Romanian Government and others to ensure that this risk does not materialise?

Reply from Hugh Robertson: That is a good question. I have not myself had discussions with the Romanian Government because the information I receive is channelled through the Olympic intelligence centre. I can give the right hon. Lady my absolute assurance—I believe she will get a security briefing within the next couple of weeks, so she will have the opportunity to ask that question herself—that I, too, will ask that specific question. As I say, there is no hard evidence to date that anything of this sort is occurring. As I said earlier, the threat is there and we will remain vigilant.

Religious Intolerance

Lord Maginnis of Drumglass: To ask Her Majesty's Government what assessment they have made of the treatment of Christians, specifically Colin Atkinson, by the Wakefield and District Housing Association; which department has oversight for this area; and what steps are being taken to ensure basic human rights for Christians.[HL11491]

The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State, Department for Communities and Local Government (Baroness Hanham): The issues of social housing and of cohesion and integration are the responsibility of the Department for Communities and Local Government. The Home Office oversees equality law.

The Government are committed to ensuring people of all faiths, including Christianity, do not suffer any unlawful discrimination. There has been no assessment of Wakefield District Housing's treatment of any religious groups. However, the Minister for Housing and Local Government publicly supported the right of Mr Atkinson to display his palm cross and subsequently welcomed the housing association's decision to change its stance.

As the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government remarked in a press notice on 19 July 2010: "Some see religion as a problem that needs to be solved. The new Government see it as part of the solution. I want to send an important signal that we value the role of religion and faith in public life".

Parliamentary Questions

Female Genital Mutilation

Baroness Tonge: To ask Her Majesty's Government whether they have plans to prepare a strategy on female genital mutilation; and, if so, what arrangements they will put in place to fund such a strategy and to co-ordinate it across government.[HL11505]

To ask Her Majesty's Government whether they plan to reinstate the role of female genital mutilation co-ordinator; and, if so, when.[HL11506]

To ask Her Majesty's Government what they are doing to encourage awareness of and debate on female genital mutilation.[HL11507]

To ask Her Majesty's Government what steps they are taking to promote outreach in communities regarding female genital mutilation.[HL11510]

Reply from the Minister of State, Home Office (Baroness Browning): The Government are absolutely committed to tackling and preventing female genital mutilation (FGM). There are no plans for a separate government strategy, as tackling FGM is a key part of the Government's integrated approach to ending violence against women and girls. The *Call to End Violence Against Women and Girls: Action Plan*, which was published earlier this year, includes commitments to:

develop learning programmes for the police on FGM;support community engagement work to tackle FGM;develop guidelines on FGM for prosecutors; andreview the multi-agency guidelines on FGM.

To meet these commitments, the work of the FGM co-ordinator is being continued by a steering group made up of the relevant departments, including the Home Office, Foreign and Commonwealth Office, Department for Education, Department for International Development and Department of Health. As a result, we have made significant progress in raising awareness of FGM and supporting professionals to intervene. For example, more than 40,000 leaflets and 40,000 posters have been circulated to schools, health services, charities and community groups around the country, and we have established a regular forum for the voluntary and community sector to raise concerns with the Government.

This forum is also used to map community engagement work and identify best practice. In addition, the new multi-agency practice guidelines are helping to ensure that professionals are able and confident to intervene to protect girls at risk.

Meat: Labelling

Tim Farron: To ask the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs if she will bring forward proposals to introduce meat labelling that indicates whether the animal slaughtered has been stunned or non-stunned. [70316]

Reply from James Paice: While the Government remain of the view that it would prefer to see all animals stunned before slaughter it has, over the last few months, made it clear that it has no plans to ban the slaughter of animals without a pre cut stun where this is done for religious purposes to meet the needs of a particular religious community. However, Ministers have made it clear that they will wish to discuss options for improving the welfare of animals slaughtered without stunning with the Jewish and Muslim communities. This will be done in the context of work to implement the new EU Regulation (No 1099/2009) on the protection of animals at the time of killing, which comes into effect on 1 January 2013. There will be full consultation with all interested parties before any final decisions are taken.

After the Nazis came to power in Germany in 1933, Jews were subjected to increasingly discriminatory treatment accompanied by organised violence. On November 9th 1938, the Nazis started a pogrom against the Jews. Synagogues were set on fire. Jewish shops had their windows smashed across the country, which gave rise to the name "Kristallnacht", which freely translated means the Night of Broken Glass. Many Jews were physically attacked too. The "Kristallnacht" pogrom is usually seen as the symbolic beginning of the Holocaust. On 9 November each year the UNITED network organises a European-wide campaign to commemorate the past and to protest against contemporary forms of fascism and antisemitism. For information see
