S4M-11060 Christina McKelvie: Positive Action in Housing—That the Parliament commends the ongoing work of the charitable organisation, Positive Action in Housing, which aims to provide advice, information and support to people from new migrant, refugee and minority ethnic communities; recognises its more recent focus on providing emergency support to people who it believes have been forced into destitution by the UK Government's policy toward rights-exhausted asylum seekers; understands that the charity has provided over 1,400 emergency crisis payments, totalling over £28,000, to prevent people going hungry or destitute and that this represents an 11% increase in the last year; further understands that it has provided 505 nights of free shelter in the homes of accommodation volunteers and made 248 payments to destitute people attending its night shelter; congratulates Positive Action in Housing on what it considers its strength and resolve in providing support to otherwise forgotten people, and hopes that while this

S4M-11050 Christina McKelvie: Forced Marriage Legislation—That the Parliament commends the forced marriage legislation that comes into effect in Scotland on 30

Other Scottish Parliament and Government Parliamentary Motion (continued)

September 2014, which makes the act of forcing someone into marriage a criminal offence; acknowledges that Scottish courts already have the power to protect both men and women affected by forced marriage through the implementation of forced marriage protection orders; recognises that Scotland was the first country in the UK to make it a criminal offence to violate an order, with penalties of a fine, up to two years in prison or both; congratulates what it considers such a progressive manifestation, and considers it a strong measure for protecting some of the most vulnerable in society as well as emphasising a widespread message of support for victims and demonstrating Scotland's unequivocal opposition to forced marriage.
