Scottish Parliament Written Answers

The following two questions both received the same answer

NHS: Racism

Monica Lennon (Labour) [S6W-22099] To ask the Scottish Government what action it is taking to tackle racist incidents in the NHS.

Monica Lennon (Labour) [S6W-22100] To ask the Scottish Government what action it is

taking to protect NHS staff from racial harassment.

Reply from Michael Matheson: There is no place for racism in the NHS and in Scottish society as a whole.

We have been clear to Health Boards that incidents of racial harassment must be taken seriously and fully investigated. In 2020 we launched the national NHS Scotland Bullying and Harassment Policy to support staff affected by these issues. This includes information on sources of confidential advice and support.

We have also been clear that all instances of violent and aggressive behaviour, including hate crime, should be recorded and if it is a serious incident, then it should be escalated to the Police, as quickly as possible.

The Scottish Government has a programme of work underway to integrate anti-racist/anti-discriminatory approaches and develop networks of allies across the NHS. We established the NHS ethnic minority forum in 2021 to amplify the voices of ethnic minority staff across the health service and tackle issues of systemic racism. We are working with the Coalition for Racial Equality and Rights to develop anti-racist training resources for staff, by 2024. We are also working with NHS Chairs and Chief Executives to ensure they have anti-racist and wider equality objectives, including meaningful action on diversity and inclusion.

Scottish Parliament Motions

Michelle Thomson (SNP) [S6M-11008] Celebrating St Andrew’s Day – That the Parliament celebrates St Andrew’s Day on 30 November 2023; recognises what it sees as the local, national and global importance of celebrating this annual event; considers that St Andrew’s Day provides an opportunity for the people of Scotland to celebrate their national identity, cultural diversity, and place as one of the oldest nations in the international community; notes with thanks the efforts of the former MSP, Dennis Canavan, who has worked hard to gain cross-party agreement to make St Andrew’s Day a national holiday in Scotland; considers what it sees as the economic benefits that global recognition of St Andrew’s Day brings to Scotland, through the culture, business, education, tourism and retail sectors; further considers that the use of the Saltire as the national flag and identifier of Scottish produce and marketing has created a globally recognised brand; believes that St Andrew is an internationally recognisable figure within faith communities; notes that St Andrew has been a patron saint of Scotland since the 14th century and is

also a patron of many other countries, which it considers brings together different nationalities, faiths and cultures; acknowledges the events that will be hosted by those countries that identify St Andrew as their patron saint and will use the Saltire, and what it sees as the important links with Scotland that these events promote globally; commends all those in Scotland who celebrate St Andrew's Day in recognition of this national day, and looks forward to future events being held across the world in maintaining connections to Scotland.

Pam Gosal (Conservative) [S6M-11011] Celebrating Diwali 2023 – That the Parliament wishes a Happy Diwali to all those celebrating in the UK and around the world; notes that Diwali will be celebrated on 12 November 2023; further notes that the festival is celebrated by several different religions, including Hindus, Sikhs and Jains; understands that Diwali, commonly known as the festival of lights, symbolises the triumph of light over darkness; further understands that Sikhs celebrate Bandi Chhor Divas, which is when Guru Har Gobind, the sixth Sikh Guru, was released from prison, along with 52 other princes in 1619, and considers that the communities celebrating Diwali have provided Scotland with a significant enrichment of both its culture and its economic prosperity.

Jackson Carlaw (Conservative) [S6M-11017] Calderwood Lodge Primary School 60-year Celebration – That the Parliament congratulates Calderwood Lodge Primary, the only Jewish school in Scotland, on reaching its 60th anniversary year; understands that the school was originally established by the Jewish community in a detached house, Calderwood Lodge, in the Newlands area of Glasgow, with an extension built as the school roll increased, and that it was initially run by the Glasgow Board of Jewish Education and subsequently taken over by Strathclyde Region, then Glasgow City Council, and finally East Renfrewshire Council; acknowledges that, in recognition of this milestone, the school is hosting a 60-year celebration event for current and past pupils, families and members of the wider community, with the day to include festivities and activities for children; understands that, in August 2017, Calderwood Lodge officially relocated from the school's previous site in Newlands to a new building in Newton Mearns to become one half of the first Jewish-Catholic joint campus to be established anywhere in the world, alongside St Clare's Primary; recognises that the joint campus was a £17 million development in East Renfrewshire, with the two primary schools sharing a central amphitheatre, sports pitches and an obstacle course that is located outdoors; notes that the Chief Rabbi, Sir Ephraim Mirvis, will be in attendance at the 60-year celebration event, and believes that Calderwood Lodge is an asset to East Renfrewshire and to Scottish education, that it is viewed with great pride by the Jewish community, and that the Jewish-Catholic joint primary school campus in Newton Mearns is a powerful example of two different faith groups working closely together whilst at the same time maintaining and adhering to their own religious identities.

Fulton MacGregor (SNP) [S6M-11006] Celebrating the 36th Anniversary of the Pakistan Welfare Trust and the Life of Dr Imtiaz "Jimmy" Majid – That the Parliament celebrates the recent 36th anniversary of the Pakistan Welfare Trust, which coincided with the 76th anniversary of Pakistan's independence; understands that the Trust was founded in 1987 in order to provide the Pakistani community in Scotland with advice and support on a large number of civic issues; further understands that the Trust has advised the community on matters including immigration, race relations, education, health and social services; acknowledges that the Trust is a secular, non-profit and apolitical organisation, which, it believes, has served the Pakistani community in Scotland excellently during its

36-year existence; considers that organisations such as the Pakistan Welfare Trust are integral to fostering integration and the celebration of ethnic culture in Scotland for all of its citizens; notes with sadness the recent passing of Dr Imtiaz “Jimmy” Majid who, it understands, played a key role in the running of the trust; understands that Imtiaz was the president of the trust for 2013-14 and 2016-17, and held the role of general secretary for 2014-15, and that, outwith these dates, he was an executive member and secretary for the trustees; applauds Imtiaz's other contributions to civic life in Scotland and as a community leader, including as a local councillor for the Coatbridge South Ward between 2012 and 2017, and extends its heartfelt condolences to his family, friends and colleagues.
