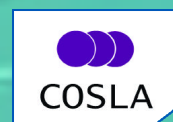

It will examine how social capital can be maximized for the benefit of Scottish society and our economy and it will start to describe how a pluralist society will be crucial to our future wellbeing. It will then look at the roles and best practices of some key agencies currently working in the field.
