# **Summary:**

Our vision is of a Scotland that is equal, inclusive and responsive: A society where:

- people from the diverse communities are valued, treated with dignity and respect,
- · have equal citizenship, opportunities and equality of life,
- and who actively participate in civic society.

Cultural expression as a conduit for integration, celebration of diversity and promotion of active citizenship have been key themes within the Multicultural Homecoming programmes message.

These 'Positive Cultural Interfaces' facilitated through the MCH14 programme have sought to provide a new dimension for interaction, experience and recognition for our diverse communities.

In short Scotland's heritage and traditions are a 'Living Tradition' – Our diverse communities enrich Scotlish identity and become part of her story and future.

The Multicultural Homecoming Programme has been recipient to a significant number of applications from across Scotland. This is reflective of the Scottish 2011 census which indicated that our cultural and ethnic minority communities had doubled in size from  $2-4\,^{1}\%$  of the national population between 2001 and 2011.

The level, ingenuity and necessity of applications made it apparent that we would need to try and 'spread' the funding allocation across as many communities as possible to mitigate this increase in numbers and objective to integrate minority communities into the 'Homecoming' celebrations.

Currently the statistical outputs from the 2011 census continue to put Ethnic Minority communities into silo's based upon visual characteristics.<sup>2</sup>

BEMIS Scotland include all minority communities under our terms of recognition and interpretation of the Equality Act and this is reflected in our inclusion of communities who do not traditionally identity their ethnic or cultural identity via visual characteristics. Within the small grants scheme this has included; Afghan, Polish, Russian, Japanese, Nepalese, Hispanic, Irish, Iranian, Jewish and Chinese communities.

Taking into consideration the 'Polish', 'Irish' + 'white other' census variables the accurate figure of Scotland's ethnic minority communities in their entirety is 8.2%<sup>3</sup>.

This is reflected in the funding allocation and contributed to the increased demand on the 'Multicultural Homecoming Programme'.

The funding rationale therefore was to provide organisations with at the least a minimum grant required to host an event as articulated within their budget headings.

For example, where core costs were hall + food and additional costs included photographer and t-shirts we allocated core costs only.

Events for all, African, Indian and Polish communities were the largest recipients followed by a collage of Scotland's diverse communities. The majority of applications were from Glasgow, unsurprising in that it hosts 16% (including Polish + Irish) of Scotland's EM population.









# **Geographical spread of Successful Applicants**







