The Cost of Living crisis


What is the cost of living crisis?

An ongoing challenge for people and families across Scotland, with many struggling to make ends meet.

Purpose of Cost of Living Campaign:

To reach large numbers of adults in Scotland at pace, increasing awareness of the support available while also reassuring them that they are not alone if worried about the current cost of living.

To help, a one stop shop digital portal has been created to hold all relevant information, help, support and guidance from a number of organisations and charities that everyone can benefit from.



Target audiences

Primary audience:

Low income households with little or no savings.

Secondary audience:

Those who have not traditionally considered themselves to need financial support.



Eligible children can access 1,140 hours of funded childcare.

The Scottish Child Payment helps families on low incomes with a weekly payment for every eligible child.

Best Start payments can help towards the costs of being pregnant or looking after a child.
